## **Critical questions for place-conscious learning**



Educator David Greenwood offers three broad questions to use when interrogating places. For each question, he provides further questions to guide and support students undertaking place-based inquiries and actions.

## HISTORICAL

#### What happened here?

- Who were the original inhabitants, both human and other-than-human?
- What are the indigenous stories of this place?
- What were and what are indigenous relationships with this place, and how have these relationships, and the place itself, changed or persisted over time?

#### SOCIO-ECOLOGICAL

# What is happening here now, and in what direction is this place headed?

- What are the dominant stories attached to this place today?
- What stories are marginalised or silent here?
- What is the voice of the land itself saying?

### ETHICAL

#### What should happen here?

- What needs to be remembered?
- What needs to be recovered or restored?
- What needs to be conserved or maintained?
- What needs to be changed or transformed?
- What needs to be created?
